Message from the Compliance Team

Christmas, has come and gone, but some of the not so great problems have also come but unfortunately not gone.

Christmas is an expensive time for our tenants; the buying of presents, the cost of wrapping

paper, cards, tree decorations, house decorations and the list goes on and on.

Some tenants under this sort of financial pressure just stop paying rent, and while the rent money does help with expenses in the short term, it can actually be very costly, very quickly, and in some cases lead to eviction.

So we have a solution:

Gunida Gunyah does not like to evict tenants for rent arrears. The fact that we must evict some tenants leads to great distress on tenants and Gunida Gunyah. We work every day in a vast amount of local communities and we understand the difficulties that exist, especially when it comes to finances. We are after all members of the same communities.

Our solution, pay only a few dollars extra each rent payment so that; one, as a tenant you are in compliance with your Lease Agreement and second, you will be well in advance by the time Christmas comes around again.

Here is a list of why you should increase your rent payments by a few dollars each week:

- 1. You are in advance;
- every Tenant should be two weeks in advance. This is something which you agree when moving in and sign in the Lease Agreement.
- 2. You are ahead; if
- you are able to pay a few dollars more each rent, you will find that when times of financial stress approaches, such as Christmas or when car rego and insurance are due, you will have money in your rent account already.
- 3. You will have a
- good record; your rent ledger will put you in good stead when needing it for other rentals or when needing a reference or even mortgage payments if you want to purchase something in the future.
